On Line Payments

When paying for events on line, please ensure that you use the correct Payment Code (<u>https://staustellu3a.org/group-account-codes</u>) and pay into the correct account. If in doubt contact a member of the Treasury Team or your Group Leader.

Riviera Travel – Benefits for u3a

Riviera Travel operate an "Affinity" Charity Scheme with the Trust that can benefit all u3as. Riviera Travel will donate 10% of the total basic cost of holidays booked by members as a charitable donation back to the u3a. Any holiday booked by a member with Riviera Travel is eligible.

How it works:

- Make a booking by contacting Riviera Travel directly, simply mention you are a member of u3a and want to claim Affinity Commission for your u3a.
- At the end of your holiday, Riviera Travel make a payment to the Third Age Trust. After deducting a handling fee, the Third Age Trust will pass the donation on to the relevant u3a.

If booking online, use: <u>www.u3ariviera.co.uk</u> it 'tags' u3a in general to the booking and then we will be prompted to check which local u3a is to benefit.

Car Sharing

Many members sensibly car share when attending events. Some questions have been raised regarding how insurance may affect this practice.

The Association of British Insurers is supportive of car and ride sharing platforms. ABI motor insurers have agreed that your insurance cover will not be affected if your passengers contribute towards your journey costs (including fuel, vehicle depreciation and associated vehicle running costs), as long as lifts are given in a vehicle seating eight passengers or less. This does not apply if you make a profit from payments received or if carrying passengers is your business.

If in doubt speak to your insurer.
